GETTING STARTED

1.	Search for available referee clinics at www.refcentre.com/BC
2.	Student completes registration and payment; a RefCentre account is created. *Important Note*: remember the username (email address) and password set up at the time of registration. This will be your RefCentre login information.
3.	To access your RefCentre account go to www.refcentre.com
4.	Student begins the online theory component, by attending the 1st - 2hr webinar (zoom session) • Zoom meeting link will be emailed to students approx. 3-4 days prior to the session
5.	Student then attends the 2 nd - 2hr webinar (zoom session) Zoom meeting link will be emailed to students approx. 3-4 days prior to the session
6.	 Once student has attended both webinars (zoom sessions), student will complete an online exam via RefCentre The exam is an open book exam. Before you start the exam, ensure that you have a copy of the Small Sided Rules Book available to assist you. Once you begin the exam, you will have 1hr and 20 minutes to complete the exam. A passing mark of 70% is required Students who do not successfully pass the Small Sided clinic in the first instance, will be given one opportunity to re-take the exam. Students will need to wait 48hrs to re-take the exam.
7.	Students who successfully pass the online exam, will be eligible to attend the on-field practical session scheduled for their clinic with a BC Soccer instructor. • Referee badges will be provided at on-field practical session
8.	Upon completion of the practical on-field session, students will be required to complete their feedback and graduation process in RefCentre in order to graduate and receive their referee certification.
9.	All participants are required to successfully complete the online theory component, and on-field practical component in order to graduate and complete the Small Sided Referee Clinic. Individuals who successfully complete the Small Sided Referee clinic will be classified as a Small Sided Referee .
